# **INCLUSIVE POST-SECONDARY**



IPSE gives students with intellectual disabilities the opportunity to attend college with their peers who may or may not have a disability. They participate in the same classes, same clubs, same residences, and same athletics as students who may not have an intellectual disability.

FOR THE LAST SCHOOL YEAR (2021-2022).GA IPSE GRADS WERE EMPLOYED AT A RATE OF 58% JUST 90-DAYS AFTER GRADUATION.

Nationally, people with independent living disabilities are employed at just 19%. In Georgia, that same group is employed at 15%.
